AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE SETTING OF RATES FOR
NURSING HOMES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 30L of chapter 7 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after the third paragraph the following
- 3 paragraph: —
- 4 The commission shall set all rates of payment on a prospective
- 5 basis and no rates shall be set on a retroactive basis.

As the Commission is authorized by the Act to report to the House the results of its investigations, it has the honor to submit herewith the report of the Commission on the subject of the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of New York.

The Commission was organized on January 1, 1913, and has since that time been engaged in a study of the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of New York.

In its report to the House and Senate on January 1, 1914, the Commission stated that it had completed its study of the proposed amendments and had prepared a report thereon.

Chapter I of the report deals with the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of New York, and Chapter II deals with the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the State of New York.
