## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO MAKE ENTRY ON PRIVATE LAND FOR PURPOSE OF SURVEYS, SOUNDINGS AND DRILLINGS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 3(o) of chapter 161A of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph: —  
3 Whenever the authority deems it necessary to make surveys,  
4 soundings, drillings or examinations to obtain information for  
5 or to expedite the construction of rapid transit facilities or  
6 other projects under its jurisdiction, the authority, its author-  
7 ized agents or employees may, after due notice by registered  
8 mail, enter upon any lands, waters and premises, not including  
9 buildings, in the commonwealth for the purpose of making  
10 surveys, soundings, drillings and examinations as they may  
11 deem necessary or convenient for the purposes of this act, and  
12 such entry shall not be deemed a trespass nor shall an entry for  
13 such purposes be deemed an entry under any condemnation  
14 proceedings which may be then pending. The authority shall  
15 make reimbursement for any injury or actual damage resulting  
16 to such lands, waters and premises caused by any act of its  
17 authorized agents or employees and shall so far as possible  
18 restore such lands to the same condition as prior to the making  
19 of such surveys, soundings, drillings or examinations.
