AN ACT REQUIRING IN-SERVICE AND SUPERVISORY TRAINING FOR MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY POLICE OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 96B of chapter 41 of the General Laws as most
2 recently amended by chapter 742 of the acts of 1968, is
3 hereby amended by striking the last paragraph and inserting in
4 place thereof the following new paragraph: —

5 Every regular police officer on a permanent full-time basis in
6 any such city or town, the metropolitan district commission
7 police or the capitol police or the Massachusetts Bay Trans-
8 portation Authority police shall be assigned to and shall attend
9 a police training school approved by the municipal police
10 training council for the purpose of completing an approved
11 course of study of in-service training at such intervals and for
12 such periods of time as the council may determine.

The Commission on the Administration of the Court System

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-One

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE STUDY AND REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE COURT SYSTEM AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES OF SUCH COMMISSIONERS.

SECTION 1. That the Governor and Senate of the State of Wisconsin be and they are hereby authorized to appoint a Commission on the Administration of the Court System, and to fix the number of its members and to provide for its compensation and expenses.

SECTION 2. That the Commission shall consist of seven members, three to be appointed by the Governor and four by the Senate, and that the Governor shall designate the members to be appointed by him, and the Senate shall designate the members to be appointed by it.

SECTION 3. That the Commission shall hold its first session on the first day of January next following the date of its appointment, and shall thereafter hold regular sessions at least once in each month, but not more than four times in any one year. The Commission may also hold special sessions at such times and places as it may deem proper. It shall hold its sessions in the State Capitol building at Madison, Wisconsin, unless it shall determine otherwise.
