RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A STATE LOAN AGENCY OR OUTRIGHT GRANTS TO ENABLE QUALIFIED NEEDY STUDENTS TO ATTEND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two
2 members of the senate, three members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, the commissioner of education or his designee, and
4 three persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby
5 established for the purpose of making an investigation and
6 study relative to the feasibility of establishing a state loan
7 agency or outright grants to enable qualified needy students to
8 attend institutions of higher learning in the commonwealth.
9 Said commission shall, in the course of its investigation and
10 study, review similar programs in the state of California and
11 New York and any other related matters.
