AN ACT PROHIBITING THE REMOVAL OF CERTAIN GRAVE MARKERS
PLACED ON THE GRAVES OF WAR VETERANS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any special or general law
2 to the contrary, no upright standard marker decorated with
3 the flag of the United States and placed on the grave of a war
4 veteran by a duly chartered veterans' organization shall be
5 removed from such location except upon the request of the next
6 of kin of such veteran.

THE CONFERENCE WAS ORGANIZED BY THE FACULTY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO, AND WAS HELD AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO, ILLINOIS, ON THE TWENTY-NINTH AND THirtiETH DAYS OF SEPTEMBER, 1929.
