Marshall for legislation to provide for the reimbursement of travel expenses of officers and employees of the Commonwealth whose major duties require them to travel for the benefit of the Commonwealth. **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.**

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REIMBURSEMENT OF TRAVEL EXPENSES OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH WHOSE MAJOR DUTIES REQUIRE THEM TO TRAVEL FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph 1 of section 25 of chapter 30 of the General Laws  
2 is hereby amended by inserting, in line 9, after the word "day"  
3 the following words: — and those whose major duties require  
4 them to travel for the benefit of the commonwealth elsewhere  
5 than to and from an assigned office of the commonwealth, —  
6 so as to read as follows: — State officers, and members of  
7 departments receiving a salary or its equivalent, who are pro-  
8 vided with offices by the commonwealth and whose duties  
9 require attendance at such offices, shall not be allowed or paid  
10 by the commonwealth any expenses in the nature of traveling  
11 or living expenses.

12 Such officers or members of departments whose duties re-  
13 quire them to travel elsewhere than to and from the offices  
14 provided for them by the commonwealth, and unpaid state  
15 officers or members of departments, and those whose duties do  
16 not require daily attendance and who receive compensation by  
17 the day, and those whose major duties require them to travel  
18 for the benefit of the commonwealth elsewhere than to and  
19 from an assigned office of the commonwealth, shall be allowed  
20 their actual and reasonable expenses incurred in the perfor-  
21 mance of such duties, if such expenses are authorized by law  
22 to be paid by the commonwealth.
