By Mr. McGlynn of Medford, petition of the Massachusetts State Employees Association for legislation to increase to sixteen cents per mile the mileage allowance for state employees operating their own motor vehicles on official business. Public Service.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ADJUSTMENT OF THE MILEAGE ALLOWANCE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES OPERATING THEIR OWN AUTOMOBILES ON OFFICIAL BUSINESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The allowance to state employees for expenses incurred by
- 2 them in the operation of motor vehicles owned by them and
- 3 used in the performance of their official duties shall not be less
- 4 than sixteen cents per mile.
