### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF MOTORBOATS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (b) of section 3 of chapter 90B of the General  
2 Laws as appearing in section 2 of chapter 275 of the acts of  
3 1960 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the  
4 following sentences: —

5 The Director shall issue prepaid certificates of number of a  
6 motorboat to a manufacturer or dealer who may issue the same  
7 to the owner of a newly purchased motorboat. The manu-  
8 facturer or dealer shall forthwith return to the Director each  
9 completed certificate of number.

The Commission of Investigation  
into the Affairs of the Government

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMMISSION OF INVESTIGATION

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That

1. The Commission of Investigation shall be organized and shall hold its first meeting on the 1st day of July, 1887.
2. The Commission shall consist of seven members, to be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.
3. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of major-general in the Army.
4. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of admiral in the Navy.
5. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of admiral in the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey.
6. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of admiral in the United States Fish Commission.
7. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of admiral in the United States Geological Survey.
8. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of admiral in the United States Army.
9. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of admiral in the United States Navy.
