AN ACT RELATIVE TO POLICE OFFICERS INJURED WHILE ON DUTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 63A of chapter 92 of the General Laws as most
2 recently amended by chapter 221 of the acts of 1923 is further
3 hereby amended by adding as the second sentence, "In deter-
4 mining the right of any officer of the department performing
5 police service, or his legal representative, to receive compensa-
6 tion under any provision of law on account of injuries or death
7 suffered by such officer while engaged in the actual per-
8 formance of police service in the course of his duties, such
9 officer shall be deemed to be so engaged while traveling on
10 public ways from his home to his station of duty and from
11 such station to his home".
