Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 55 of chapter 44 of the General Laws as amended is

3 further sentence as follows: — The said treasurer may also
4 invest part of said funds by purchasing shares or making de-
5 posits in credit unions organized under the laws of the com-
6 monwealth whose shares and deposits are insured.
