By Mr. Linsky of Brookline, petition of Martin A. Linsky and Allan R. McKinnon that cities, towns and regional school districts be reimbursed by the Commonwealth for the expenses of certain special training programs for children. Education.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO REIMBURSEMENT TO JOINT SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 46J of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following paragraph: —
- 3 One-hundred percent of the cost of the expenses for the
- 4 instruction, training and support of the children in special
- 5 classes or special instruction periods under this section actually
- 6 rendered or furnished including their necessary traveling ex-
- 7 penses, whether daily or otherwise, but not exceeding ordinary
- 8 and reasonable compensation therefor shall be reimbursed to
- 9 the towns or any regional school district by the commonwealth
- 10 upon approval of the department and certification by it that
- 11 such classes of special instruction periods meet their standard
- 12 and requirements prescribed by it. No city or town shall be
- 13 reimbursed under this section for any cost previously borne
- 14 solely by the city or town.
