AN ACT PERMITTING THE TREATMENT OF MINORS FOR DRUG ADDICTION WITHOUT PARENTAL CONSENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 119 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 39B, the following section: —

3 *Section 40.* Any hospital, sanatorium, infirmary, clinic, or
4 dispensary, licensed by the department of public health, may
5 provide treatment for drug addiction to any child who requests
6 such treatment, whether or not the parent or other person
7 responsible for the care of such child consents to such treat-
8 ment.
