## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

### AN ACT PERMITTING DANCING ON SUNDAY ANTEMERIDIAN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 33 of chapter 138 is hereby amended by striking out  
2 the last sentence and inserting in place thereof the follow-  
3 ing: — The local licensing authority shall, notwithstanding any  
4 provision of chapter one hundred and thirty-six or one hundred  
5 and forty to the contrary, authorize any licensee under section  
6 twelve who is authorized to sell alcoholic beverages on Sunday  
7 between the hours of twelve midnight and the time allowed by  
8 the local licensing authorities to sell alcoholic beverages, allow  
9 dancing between said hours.

- 1 Section 44 of Chapter 135 is hereby amended by adding and
- 2 the last sentence and inserting in lieu thereof the follow-
- 3 ing:—The total amount of all currency in circulation may
- 4 not exceed the amount of gold and silver coin in circulation
- 5 and held by the Treasury, and the amount of all notes and
- 6 certificates in circulation shall not exceed the amount of
- 7 gold and silver coin in circulation and the amount of all
- 8 gold and silver coin in circulation and the amount of all
- 9 deposits in the Treasury and in the United States
