AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF ASSISTANT REGISTERS OF PROBATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 217 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 35B, as most recently amended by chapter
3 376 of the acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following section: —

5 *Section 35B.* The salary of a first assistant register of pro-
6 bate shall be eighty per cent of the salary of the register in his
7 county.

8 The salary of a second assistant register of probate shall be
9 seventy-five per cent of the salary of the register in his county.

10 The salary of a third assistant register of probate shall be
11 seventy-five per cent of the salary of the register in his county.

12 The salary of a fourth assistant register shall be seventy-five
13 per cent of the salary of the register in his county.

14 The salary of a fifth assistant register shall be seventy-five
15 per cent of the salary of the register in his county.

16 The salary of a sixth assistant register shall be seventy-five
17 per cent of the salary of the register in his county.
