AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SUSPENSION OF RADIO AND TELEVISION TECHNICIAN LICENSES FOR CERTAIN IMPROPER PRACTICES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Section 87TTT of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 170 of the acts of 1965, is
3 hereby further amended by adding at the end the following
4 paragraph: —

5 If the board shall determine, after a hearing, that a person
6 licensed as required by section eighty-seven RRR has engaged
7 in the practice of charging excessive fees for the repair of any
8 television or radio receiver, the board may suspend his license
9 for a period of time which it deems appropriate, provided,
10 however, that such suspension shall not be imposed pending
11 the final disposition in the superior court of a review of such
12 determination.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

As amended by the Convention of 1894

ARTICLE I. OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK.

SECTION 1. The legislative power of this State shall be vested in a Senate and Assembly, which together with the Governor shall constitute the executive department of the State.

SECTION 2. The Senate shall be composed of twenty-four members, who shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State for a term of two years, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following their election.

SECTION 3. The Assembly shall be composed of fifty members, who shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State for a term of two years, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following their election.
