AN ACT PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF URBAN RENEWAL PROJECTS TO BE SENT TO THE MASSACHUSETTS HISTORICAL COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 48 of chapter 121B of the General Laws, as inserted by
2 chapter 751 of the acts of 1969, is hereby amended by adding at
3 the end of the first paragraph thereof the following sentence: —
4 Whenever a public hearing on an urban renewal plan is held,
5 notice thereof shall be sent to the Massachusetts Historical
6 Commission together with a map indicating the area to be
7 renewed.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People in each State, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 2. No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, seven Years being the Term of Service of Representatives, and who shall not, when elected, have seven Years Residence in that State: but no Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, nor born or naturalized in the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.
