

ACTS, 1980. - Chaps. 43, 44, 45.

Hersey station, in honor of Henry D. Hersey, an outstanding selectman for many years in said town and an outstanding spokesman for commuter rail service in the commonwealth. Said Authority shall attach a suitable marker thereto bearing said designation.

Chap. 43. AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITION OF CUSTODIAN IN THE TOWN HALL IN THE TOWN OF WEST SPRINGFIELD FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CIVIL SERVICE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The position of custodian in the town hall in the town of West Springfield shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. The following question shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used for the election of town officers in the town of West Springfield at the annual town meeting to be held in the current year:-

"Shall the position of custodian in the town hall be exempt from the provisions of the civil service law?"

If a majority of the votes in answer to this question is in the affirmative, section one of this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.

Chap 44. AN ACT EXEMPTING CUSTODIAL POSITIONS IN THE MORRILL MEMORIAL LIBRARY OF THE TOWN OF NORWOOD FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CIVIL SERVICE LAW AND RULES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The positions of custodian in the Morrill Memorial Library of the town of Norwood shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 45. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING DEPOSITS IN SAVINGS BANKS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

ACTS, 1980. - Chap. 46.

Subsection 1 of section 22C of chapter 168 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out clause (b), as amended by section 1 of chapter 360 of the acts of 1979, and inserting in place thereof the following clause: -

(b) the minimum amount, if any, and the maximum amount of deposit balances and the minimum period, which shall be not less than thirty days, of maintenance of such balances to which such specified rates shall apply.

Chap. 46. AN ACT ESTABLISHING A RETIREMENT AGE FOR DISTRICT ENGINEERING INSPECTORS, STATE BUILDING INSPECTORS AND STATE ELEVATOR INSPECTORS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish immediately a retirement age for district engineering inspectors, state building inspectors and state elevator inspectors, therefor it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 90G the following section:-

Section 90H. Any member in service, classified in Group 2, who is a district engineering inspector, a state building inspector or a state elevator inspector, shall continue in service, at such members option, notwithstanding such member is mentally and physically capable of performing the duties of such office or position. Such member shall annually, at such members own expense, be examined by an impartial physician designated by the retirement authority to determine such capability. No deductions shall be made from the regular compensation of each member under the provisions of this chapter for service after such member has attained age sixty-five and upon retirement such member shall receive a superannuation retirement allowance equal to that to which such member would have been entitled had such member retired at age sixty-five.

SECTION 2. Chapter seven hundred and ninety-one of the acts of nineteen hundred and seventy-nine is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect as of November fourteenth, nineteen hundred and seventy-nine.
