## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT REQUIRING EVERY ENTRANT TO BARBER SCHOOL OR BARBER COLLEGE TO HAVE COMPLETED THE TENTH GRADE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 112 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 striking out the first sentence of section 87 I and inserting in  
3 place thereof the following sentence: — Nothing in sections  
4 eighty-seven F to eighty-seven R, inclusive, shall prohibit any  
5 person sixteen years of age or over and who has completed  
6 tenth grade school work or its equivalent from serving in this  
7 commonwealth in such occupation therein as a student in any  
8 barber school or barber college approved by the board under  
9 the instruction of an instructor; provided that such instructor,  
10 or the person owning or operating such barber school or barber  
11 college shall immediately report in writing to the board the  
12 name of such student, his age and the high school which such  
13 student attended, and shall furnish to the board a certificate of  
14 a registered physician that such student is not afflicted with  
15 any contagious or infectious disease.
