AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CERTIFICATION OF NAMES TO FILL CIVIL SERVICE POSITIONS WHEN THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE HAS WAIVED RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 19 and inserting in place thereof the
3 following: —

4 *Section 19.* Except as otherwise provided by law, in all
5 positions, employments and work in any branch of the service
6 of the commonwealth, or of any county, city, town or district
7 therein, persons having domicile in the commonwealth shall be
8 given preference; provided, when the director waives domicile
9 requirements in accordance with the civil service rules or the
10 provisions of section eight B of this chapter, any person who
11 does not have domicile in the commonwealth and who qualifies
12 shall be placed on the eligible list in accordance with the civil
13 service law and rules.
