AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A CHANGE IN THE METHOD OF COMPUTING RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES FOR ALL EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH, CITIES AND TOWNS NOW CLASSIFIED AS MEMBERS OF GROUP 1.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 5 of chapter 32
2 of the General Laws as appearing in chapter 602 of the acts of
3 1960 and as amended by section 6 of chapter 826 of the acts
4 of 1967 is hereby further amended by striking out the table, as
5 so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the following table:
