## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT TO PERMIT THE PAROLE OF FIRST OFFENDERS AT ANY TIME UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding any provision of special or general law to
- 2 the contrary, any first offender sentenced to confinement in
- 3 prison for not more than ten years, may be paroled by the
- 4 parole board at any time under such terms and conditions as it
- 5 deems proper.
