1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two  
2 members of the senate, three members of the house of repre-  
3 sentatives, and three persons to be appointed by the governor,  
4 each of whom shall be a selectman, mayor or member of the  
5 city council from each of the cities and towns through which  
6 proposed interstate highway 52 is to run, is hereby established  
7 for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the  
8 delay in the construction of the north-south highway known as  
9 interstate highway 52.
