RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF THE WIDOW OF WALTER R. MCDONALD, A
FORMER MEMBER OF THE STATE POLICE.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging a moral obli-
2 gation of the commonwealth, and after an appropriation has
3 been made therefor there shall be allowed and paid out of the
4 state treasury to Mary T. McDonald of Waltham, widow of
5 Walter R. McDonald, a former member of the department of
6 public safety doing police duty, who, while on duty at the
7 Wareham barracks on September nineteenth, nineteen hundred
8 and forty, sustained injuries which resulted in his death on said
9 date, an annuity of twenty-two hundred eighty-seven dollars
10 and fifty-six cents annually, payable in equal monthly instal-
11 ments, for a period of five years, commencing on June first,
12 nineteen hundred and seventy. Said annuity shall cease upon
13 the remarriage of said Mary T. McDonald. No payment shall be
14 made hereunder until there has been filed with the comptroller
15 an agreement signed by said Mary T. McDonald that the
16 amount, if any, paid or to be paid for legal services rendered in
17 connection with the passage of this resolve shall not exceed ten
18 per cent of the maximum amount payable hereunder.
