

HOUSE No. 4079

By Mr. McGlynn of Medford, petition of John J. McGlynn relative to prohibiting the hiring of new state employees until the number of persons employed by the Commonwealth has been reduced by five per cent. Public Service.

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE HIRING OF NEW STATE EMPLOYEES UNTIL THE NUMBER OF PERSONS EMPLOYED BY THE COMMONWEALTH HAS BEEN REDUCED BY FIVE PER CENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 30 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 47 the following section: —
3 *Section 47A.* No positions classified under section forty-five
4 to fifty shall be filled on a permanent, provisional or tempo-
5 rary basis after July first, nineteen hundred and seventy-one
6 until five per cent of the persons holding such positions on said
7 date have died, retired, resigned or otherwise terminated their
8 services. The provisions of this section shall not apply to
9 positions in state hospitals or institutions of higher education
10 operated by the commonwealth.
