1 *Resolved*, That a special unpaid commission, to consist of
2 three members of the senate, five members of the house of
3 representatives, the commissioner of mental health or his
4 designee, the commissioner of public health or his designee, the
5 commissioner of education or his designee, and four persons to
6 be appointed by the governor is hereby established for the
7 purpose of making a study and investigation of the feasibility
8 of requiring pupils in the schools to be given periodic urine
9 tests to determine whether they are users of harmful drugs.
