AN ACT REQUIRING DEDUCTIBLE PROVISIONS IN CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE PHYSICAL DAMAGE POLICIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Chapter 175 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 113L the following section: —

3 *Section 113M.* Every policy of insurance providing in-
4 demnity for physical damage to motor vehicles, shall contain a
5 deductible option to the insured in the amount of two hundred
6 dollars, except that an insured may request in writing full
7 coverage. Claims of three hundred dollars or less for motor
8 vehicle damage shall be brought in the district court under the
9 provisions of sections twenty-one to twenty-five, inclusive, of
10 chapter two hundred and eighteen of the General Laws.
