By Mr. Scalli of Boston, petition of Marie E. Howe and Anthony J. Scalli that June seventeenth be designated as a legal holiday throughout the Commonwealth. The Judiciary.

AN ACT MAKING JUNE SEVENTEENTH A LEGAL HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 7 of chapter 4 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out clause Eighteen, as most recently
3 amended by section 1 of chapter 215 of the acts of 1970, and
4 inserting in place thereof the following clause: —

5 Eighteen, "Legal holiday", shall include January the first,
6 July the fourth and Christmas day, or the day following when
7 any of said days occur on Sunday, and the third Monday in
8 February, the third Monday in April, the third Monday in
9 June, the fourth Monday in October, and Thanksgiving Day.

10 "Legal holiday" shall also include, with respect to Suffolk
11 county only, March the seventeenth, or the day following when
12 said day occurs on Sunday; provided, however, that the words
13 "legal holiday" as used in section forty-five of chapter one
14 hundred and forty-nine shall not include March the seven-
15 tenth, or the day following when said day occurs on Sunday.
