*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no
- 2 openings in curbs abutting any highway may be made except
- 3 with approval of the city or town in which such highway is
- 4 located.
