AN ACT REQUIRING THE POSTING OF A PLAN OF SEATING ACCOMMODATIONS AT BOX OFFICES FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC SHOWS AND EXHIBITIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 181B the following section: —
3 *Section 181C.* Whoever operates any theatrical exhibition,
4 public show, or public amusement required to be licensed
5 under sections one hundred and eighty-one and one hundred
6 and eighty-two of this chapter and for which reserved seat
7 tickets are sold, without posting a plan or chart of the seating
8 accommodations, showing the location of each seat, in a con-
9 spicuous place on the outside of each box office or ticket
10 booth, shall be punished by a fine of not more than five
11 hundred dollars.
