**AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE SALE, USE OR POSSESSION OF AMPHETAMINE DRUGS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 198B the following section: —
- 3 *Section 198C.* No person shall sell, offer for sale, have in his
- 4 possession with intent to sell, give or furnish amphetamine
- 5 drugs. Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be
- 6 punished by a fine of one hundred dollars for each offense or
- 7 by imprisonment for not more than six months.
