RESOLUTIONS CONGRATULATING CONGRESSMAN THOMAS P. O'NEILL, JR. ON HIS APPOINTMENT AS MAJORITY WHIP IN THE UNITED STATES HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

1 *Whereas*, On January 22, 1971, Congressman Thomas P.
2 O'Neill, Jr. of Cambridge was appointed Majority Whip in the
3 United States House of Representatives; and

4 *Whereas*, Born in Cambridge, Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. has
5 served his city, state and country with distinction and honor in
6 many offices of public trust; and

7 *Whereas*, Elected to serve in the Massachusetts House of
8 Representatives from 1937 to 1952 he was the minority leader
9 in that body in 1947 and 1948 and from 1949 through 1952
10 was the first Democrat to serve as its Speaker. In 1946 and
11 1947 he was a member of the Cambridge School Committee.
12 On November 4, 1952 Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. was elected as a
13 member of the United States Congress from the old Massachu-
14 setts 11th Congressional District to succeed the late President
15 John F. Kennedy and has continued to receive the support and
16 confidence of his friends and neighbors since that date by
17 being retained by them as their congressman; and

18 *Whereas*, In 1964 he was awarded the William V. McKenny
19 medal by Boston College and the Distinguished Service Award
20 by the Massachusetts Building and Construction Trades Council
21 and today is a member of the Board of Directors of Boston
22 College; and

23 *Whereas*, Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. gains the respect, confidence
24 and affection of all who have the opportunity to observe his
25 devotion to duty, his friendly and kindly manner and his
26 dedicated sense of public service; and

27 *Whereas*, Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. is a credit to his family, the
28 commonwealth and the nation; therefore be it

29 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives
30 sincerely congratulates Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. on his appoint-
31 ment as Majority Whip in the United States House of Repre-
32 sentatives and extends its best wishes for continued success and
33 good health; and be it further

34 *Resolved*, That an engrossed copy of these resolutions be
35 sent forthwith by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the
36 Honorable Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr.
