## **The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL NOTIFY CERTAIN PERSONS OF INTENDED ACTION UNDER THE LAW REGULATING BUSINESS PRACTICES FOR CONSUMERS PROTECTION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The second paragraph of section 4 of chapter 93A of the
- 2 General Laws, as appearing in section 3 of chapter 814 of the
- 3 acts of 1969, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 1, the
- 4 word "ten" and inserting in place thereof the word:— five.
