## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-One.

### AN ACT REDUCING THE TIME FOR STATE EMPLOYEES TO REACH THEIR MAXIMUM SALARY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding a provision of general or special law to the  
2 contrary, employees of the commonwealth who receive com-  
3 pensation under the provisions of section forty-six of chapter  
4 thirty of the General Laws shall, after completing the proba-  
5 tionary period of six months at the minimum salary; be  
6 granted a step increase in the salary schedule and shall continue  
7 to receive a step increase each six months thereafter until the  
8 maximum salary is received at the completion of three years  
9 service.

The Executive Department

CHAPTER I. THE PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT.

SECTION 1. THE PRESIDENT. The President is elected for a term of four years, and his powers and duties are defined in the Constitution and the laws of the United States.

SECTION 2. THE VICE-PRESIDENT. The Vice-President is elected for a term of four years, and his powers and duties are defined in the Constitution and the laws of the United States.

SECTION 3. THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT. The Executive Department consists of the President, the Vice-President, and the Cabinet. The President is the head of the Executive Department, and he exercises the executive power of the United States. The Vice-President is the second in command, and he exercises the executive power in the absence of the President. The Cabinet consists of the heads of the executive departments, and they advise the President in the exercise of his executive power.
