HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, April 29, 1971.

The committee on Public Service, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 863) of Robert F. Donovan and Joseph J. C. DiCarlo for legislation to provide a fifteen percent additional salary for state institutional employees performing duty between certain hours; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1021) of the Massachusetts Public Employees Council 41, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, and Joseph D. Early for legislation to provide differential pay for certain state employees required to work evening and night tours of duty; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1402) of the Massachusetts State Employees Association and Clifford H. Marshall for legislation to provide a salary differential for night tours of duty for employees of the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1813) of John W. Olver for legislation to provide for shift differential for non-professional state employees required to work night tours of duty; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2095), of Robert F. Donovan that state employees performing duty between the hours of six o'clock post meridian and six o'clock ante meridian be provided with a ten per cent increase in salary; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3105) of the Massachusetts Nurses Association for legislation to provide for weekend differential pay for registered nurses employed by the Commonwealth, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3109) of Paul J. Corriveau that the Director of Personnel and Standardization be authorized to prescribe pay differentials for employees of the Commonwealth under certain circumstances, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3257) of the Massachusetts Nurses Association and John R. Buckley for legislation to provide for competitive shift differential pay for registered nurses employed by the Commonwealth, report recommending that the accompanying bill (House, No. 5440) ought to pass.

AN ACT PROVIDING DIFFERENTIAL PAY FOR CERTAIN STATE EMPLOYEES REQUIRED TO WORK EVENING AND NIGHT TOURS OF DUTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The Director of Personnel and Standardization is hereby
2 authorized and directed to amend Rule 9J relative to the
3 payment of differentials to certain employees who work
4 evening or night tours of duty to provide that a differential of
5 \$20 be paid to registered nurses, a differential of \$15 be paid
6 to licensed practical nurses and a differential of \$10 be paid to
7 all other nursing personnel.
