AN ACT PROVIDING THAT EMPLOYEES OF CITIES AND TOWNS WHO ARE DELEGATES TO A STATE OR NATIONAL CONVENTION OF CERTAIN VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS SHALL BE GRANTED LEAVES OF ABSENCE TO ATTEND SUCH CONVENTIONS WITHOUT LOSS OF PAY OR VACATION LEAVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 111J and inserting in place thereof the
3 following section: —

4 *Section 111J.* Any employee of a city or town who is a
5 delegate or alternate to a state or national convention of a
6 veterans' organization chartered by the Congress of the United
7 States, shall be granted a leave of absence to attend such
8 convention without loss of pay or vacation leave.
