AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF MONEY WHICH THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BERKSHIRE COUNTY MAY EXPEND IN ANY ONE YEAR FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROMOTING THE RECREATIONAL ADVANTAGES OF SAID COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Berkshire county
2 may, for the purpose of advertising the recreational advantages
3 of said county, expend such sums, not exceeding, in the aggregate,
4 sixty thousand dollars in any one year, as may be appropriated therefor;
5 provided, that such expenditures from money
6 so appropriated shall not at any time be more than triple the
7 sum which shall have been contributed by public subscription
8 or by donation deposited with the county treasurer for the purpose
9 aforesaid. Said commissioners may expend such sums only
10 for advertising in newspapers, magazines and the like, or for
11 booklets, posters or other forms of advertising, or for information
12 booths within the county, or for displays or booths maintained at
13 fairs, expositions or travel shows outside the county for the purpose
14 of advertising such advantages, or for the processing of inquiries
15 resulting from such promotional activities. In carrying out the provisions
16 of this act the commissioners may designate an agent or agents to act
17 for them; provided, that all bills incurred shall be accompanied by
18 proper vouchers and shall be paid by the county treasurer only on
19 warrants approved by the county commissioners or a majority
20 of them.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter eight hundred and thirty-six of the acts
2 of nineteen hundred and sixty-three is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
