By Mr. Harmon, a petition of Samuel Harmon, John M. Quinlan and the Mass. State Employees Assoc., by Charles C. McGlynn, President, for legislation to provide that tuition fees shall not be charged children of employees of the Commonwealth attending state colleges or universities. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT TUITION FEES SHALL NOT BE CHARGED CHILDREN OF EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH ATTENDING STATE COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the con-
- 2 trary, the children of employees of the commonwealth at-
- 3 tending any of the state colleges or the University of Massa-
- 4 chusetts or Southeastern Massachusetts University or Lowell
- 5 Technological Institute shall not be charged tuition.

State Employees Assoc., for an act to provide that certain employees of the Commonwealth attending state colleges or universities shall be considered as state employees.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH ATTENDING STATE COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the children of employees of the Commonwealth attending any of the state colleges or the University of Massachusetts or Southwestern Massachusetts University in Massachusetts shall not be charged tuition.
