RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO ENACT LEGISLATION PROHIBITING CERTAIN DESERTERS FROM THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES FROM RETURNING TO THE UNITED STATES FOR A CERTAIN TIME.

*Resolved*, That the General Court of Massachusetts respectfully urges the Congress of the United States to enact legislation providing that any person who deserts the armed forces of the United States during a time of conflict and goes to a foreign country shall be prohibited from returning to the United States until five years after the termination of the conflict in which the person deserted; and be it further

*Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted forthwith by the state secretary to the President of the United States, to the presiding officer of each branch of the Congress and to each member thereof from the commonwealth.
