AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SEVENTY FOR GEORGE B. SHEEHAN, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF SUPERVISOR RECREATION FACILITY, CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM, IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. George B. Sheehan, incumbent of the office of
2 supervisor recreation facility, construction program, in the
3 department of public works, shall hold said office during good
4 behavior until he reaches age seventy, unless incapacitated by
5 physical or mental disability from performing the duties
6 thereof, but he may be removed therefrom for cause after
7 hearing in the manner provided by section forty-three of
8 chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Organization of the Board of Health

in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Six

An Act providing for the organization of the State Board of Health, and for the appointment of its members, is hereby enacted, the provisions thereof to read:

That the State Board of Health shall consist of seven members, to be appointed by the Governor, and that the members shall be appointed as follows:

1. The Governor, the State Board of Health, the State Board of Agriculture, the State Board of Education, the State Board of Prisoners, the State Board of Pensions, and the State Board of Charities.

2. The Governor, the State Board of Health, the State Board of Agriculture, the State Board of Education, the State Board of Prisoners, the State Board of Pensions, and the State Board of Charities.

Section 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.
