# SENATE . . . . . No. 1109

By Mr. Tobin, a petition of Arthur H. Tobin, Thomas F. Brownell, Clifford H. Marshall and Joseph E. Brett for legislation to direct the Metropolitan District Commission to construct certain drainage and flood control facilities along Furnace Brook in the city of Quincy. Urban Affairs.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONSTRUCT CERTAIN DRAINAGE AND FLOOD CONTROL FACILITIES ALONG FURNACE BROOK IN THE CITY OF QUINCY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission is hereby  
2 authorized and directed to construct and maintain such tun-  
3 nels and surface conduits and appurtenant works as may be  
4 necessary along Furnace Brook in the city of Quincy in order  
5 to improve drainage and to relieve flood conditions.

1 SECTION 2. To meet the expiditures necessary in carry-  
2 ing out the provisions of section one, the state treasurer shall,  
3 upon request of the governor, issue and sell at public or private  
4 sale bonds of the commonwealth, registered or with interest  
5 coupons attached, as he may deem best, to an amount to be  
6 specified by the governor from time to time, but not exceeding  
7 in the aggregate, the sum of three million six hundred thou-  
8 sand dollars. All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as afore-  
9 said, shall be designated on their face, Furnace Brook Flood  
10 Control Loan, Act of 1972, and shall be on the serial payment  
11 plan for such maximum term of years, not exceeding twenty  
12 years, as the governor may recommend to the general court  
13 pursuant to Section 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to

14 the Constitution of the Commonwealth, the maturities thereof  
15 to be so arranged that the amounts payable in the several  
16 years of the period of amortization other than the final year  
17 shall be as nearly equal as in the opinion of the state treasurer  
18 it is practicable to make them. Said bonds shall bear interest  
19 semiannually at such rate as the state treasurer, with the ap-  
20 proval of the governor, shall fix. The initial maturities of such  
21 bonds shall be payable not later than one year from the date  
22 of issue thereof and the entire issue not later than June thir-  
23 tieth, nineteen hundred and ninety-two. All interest payments  
24 and payments on account of principal on such obligations  
25 shall be paid from metropolitan district commission park  
26 funds, to be assessed by methods fixed by law.
