ARTICLE 35. I move the Town approve a petition to be filed with the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts petitioning a special law providing: Lindolph O. Parker, Fire Chief of the Town of Granby, shall not be required to retire upon attaining the maximum age for the group as provided in the General Laws of the Commonwealth, and he shall be allowed to continue as an employee of the Town of Granby as Fire Chief until he reaches the age of 70 or retires voluntarily prior to that time.

AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SEVENTY FOR LINDOLPH O. PARKER, INCUMBENT IN THE OFFICE OF FIRE CHIEF OF THE TOWN OF GRANBY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Lindolph O. Parker, incumbent in the office of fire chief of
2 the town of Granby, shall hold said office during good behavior
3 until he reaches age seventy or retires voluntarily prior there-
4 to; unless incapacitated by physical or mental disabilities from
5 performing the duties thereof, notwithstanding his attaining
6 the maximum age for his retirement group; but he may be
7 removed therefrom for cause after hearing in the manner pro-
8 vided by section forty-three of chapter thirty-one of the Gen-
9 eral Laws.
