**AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAID HOLIDAYS FOR MEMBERS OF THE
CAPITOL POLICE.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any rule, regulation or pro-
2 vision of law to the contrary, a member of the Capitol Police
3 Force who is required to work on a legal holiday or whose
4 regular day off falls on a legal holiday shall be entitled to an
5 additional day's pay.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DUTIES OF MEMBERS OF THE
LEGISLATURE.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Joint Assembly, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any rule, resolution or
order of law to the contrary, a member of the Senate or
House who is entitled to vote on a legal holiday or
a regular day off shall on a legal holiday shall be entitled to an
additional day's pay.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
