In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR STAMPING OF CERTAIN ENGINEERING PLANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 143, Section 54A of the General Laws as most re-
- 2 cently amended is further amended by adding a second para-
- 3 graph as follows: —
- 4 Whenever plans for electrical, heating, ventilating, plumb-
- 5 ing and structural are required to be filed, such plans shall
- 6 bear the seal of a professional engineer, otherwise they shall
- 7 not be accepted or approved by those persons referred to in
- 8 the first paragraph of this section.

By the Senate (by message) a resolution of being laid on the table and another for legislation to provide for securing of certain engineering laws from the Administration.

The Constitutionality of the Engineering Law

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Two

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR EXAMINING FOR CERTAIN ENGINEERING PLANS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Chapter 113, Section 544 of the General Laws as amended in 1917 and amended is further amended by adding a second paragraph as follows:—
2. Whenever plans for electrical, heating, ventilating, plumbing and mechanical are required to be filed with plans shall bear the seal of a registered engineer otherwise they shall not be accepted or approved by those persons referred to in the first paragraph of this section.
