AN ACT ALLOWING CREDIT UNDER THE NEWTON RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO EDWARD A. FAHEY FOR CERTAIN SERVICE RENDERED BY HIM AS AN ELECTED OFFICIAL OF THE CITY OF NEWTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Edward A. Fahey, a former alderman of the
2 city of Newton and a member of the Newton retirement sys-
3 tem, shall be entitled to count as creditable service for purposes
4 of retirement, as a member of said system, the time spent by
5 him as an alderman for the city of Newton during the follow-
6 ing periods: — January 1, 1927 to December 31, 1942, Jan-
7 uary 1, 1946 to December 31, 1952; provided, that before the
8 date any retirement allowance becomes effective for him, he
9 pay into the annuity savings fund of the Newton retirement
10 system such amount as the Newton retirement board may
11 determine as being equal to that which he would have paid
12 into said fund has his service as such alderman been creditable
13 service under the Newton retirement system, with interest
14 thereon.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by
2 the city of Newton.
