AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ABSENTEE VOTING BY REGISTERED
VOTERS OVER THE AGE OF SIXTY-FIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 86 of chapter 54 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after the word "voter", in line 1, as
- 3 appearing in section 1 of chapter 213 of the acts of 1961, the
- 4 words: — age sixty-five or over, or any voter.

By Mr. GARDNER a petition presented by Mrs. Gardner, in 1850, of
John M. Gardner for signature to grants for education, under the
act passed over the age of sixty-five. (S. 1850, p. 100.)

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ACT RELATIVE TO THE
SIXTY-FIVE AND SIXTY-SIX

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1 Section 55 of chapter 54 of the Statutes shall be amended
2 amended by inserting after the word "over," in line 1, as
3 appearing in section 1 of chapter 211 of the acts of 1857, the
4 words:— "and sixty-five or over or sixty-six."
