AN ACT DESIGNATING THE SWIMMING POOL ON NORTH AVENUE IN THE CITY OF ATTLEBORO AS THE GEORGE I. SPATCHER SWIMMING POOL.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The swimming pool on North Avenue in the city of Attle-
- 2 boro shall, when completed, be known and designated as the
- 3 George I. Spatcher swimming pool, and a suitable marker
- 4 bearing said designation shall be erected by the Department
- 5 of Natural Resources.

The Constitution of the State

In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two

the people of the State of [State] did give their assent to the Constitution of the State, which is as follows:

Section 1. The legislative power of the State shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives, which shall be styled the General Assembly.

1. The members of the Senate shall be elected by the people of the State at large, and shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.
2. The members of the House of Representatives shall be elected by the people of the State at large, and shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.
3. The General Assembly shall be styled the General Assembly.
