SENATE No. 989

By Mr. Quinlan, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 989) of John M. Quinlan, Joseph F. Timilty and another for legislation relative to the retirement allowance of employees who have thirty-two years of creditable service and have attained age sixty. Public Service.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE THIRTY-TWO YEARS OF CREDITABLE SERVICE AND HAVE ATTAINED AGE SIXTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter thirty-two of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by adding at the end of said chapter the following section:
- 3 *Section 103.* Notwithstanding any other provision of this
- 4 chapter, the retirement allowance of any employee who has
- 5 thirty-two years of creditable service and has attained age
- 6 sixty shall be eighty per cent of the average annual rate of
- 7 regular compensation received by such employee during any
- 8 period of three consecutive years of creditable service for
- 9 which such rate of compensation was the highest, or the
- 10 average annual rate of regular compensation received by such
- 11 employee during the period or periods, whether consecutive
- 12 or not, constituting his last three years of creditable service
- 13 preceding retirement, whichever is the greater.
