RECOMMENDATIONS.

1. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF THE COMMISSIONER FOR THE BLIND.

In order to bring the salary of the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Commission for the Blind into balance with those salaries paid to chief executives of public agencies engaged in the carrying-out of mandates and responsibilities similar to those being administered by the Commissioner of the Massachusetts Commission for the Blind, it is recommended that the salary of said Commissioner of said Commission for the Blind be increased to twenty-two thousand five hundred per annum.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF THE COMMISSIONER FOR THE BLIND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The second sentence of the second paragraph of section 129 of
2 chapter 6 is hereby amended by striking out the words "eighteen
3 thousand two hundred and seventy-three," inserted by section 8
4 of chapter 426 of the acts of 1973, and inserting in place thereof
5 the words: - twenty-two thousand five hundred.
