AN ACT PROHIBITING CONSTRUCTION OF NEW GASOLINE SERVICE STATIONS THROUGH THE DURATION OF THE ENERGY CRISIS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
