**AN ACT REQUIRING EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATION RELATIVE TO  
ADMINISTRATING PENSION AND RETIREMENT FUNDS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 inserting after section 52A the following section: —  
3 *Section 52B.* There shall be a minimum of one representative  
4 of employees, on any board of trustees of a pension and  
5 retirement fund for the benefit of employees where such a board  
6 exists and the number of employee trustees shall be in direct  
7 relationship to the percentage of contribution to said fund.  
8 Where no such trust agreement exists and where retirement is  
9 paid from other than a trust fund there shall be required that any  
10 employer providing retirement in such a manner establish a  
11 committee for the purposes of the administration of benefits and  
12 such committee shall have employed representative of at least  
13 one but in the event of contributions shall be in direct ratio to  
14 the percentage of contributions.
